PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our Tree of Life

The tree of life appears in both the opening and closing chapters of the Bible (Genesis 2-3 and Revelation 22). In the book of Genesis, God places the tree of life and the tree of knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the Garden of Eden, where the tree of life stands as a symbol of God's life-giving presence and the fullness of eternal life available in God.

For many synagogues, a Tree of Life is used to honor or remember a celebration or happy occasion, to recognize a wonderful achievement or simcha! How fortunate we are to now have a Tree of Life of our own!

It all started about a year ago when Norma Schulman, board member here at Mountain Synagogue, asked if we might look into finding a Tree that we could place in our sanctuary (the Social Hall at All Saints/St Cyprians), and many discussions followed.

The leadership of All Saints agreed to allow us to utilize the space where they currently had a bulletin board, so all we needed was to find, order or have made, our Tree!

After many searches and inquiries, it appeared that to have one made to fit our specific available dimensions, would be quite expensive. It seemed that our efforts were turning up nothing feasible. We spoke with several members in our congregation who are accomplished woodworkers about creating our own design, but it seemed to be a very large task. Maury Burstein graciously offered a large donation towards the purchase of a Tree, if we found the right one.

Donna Sinrich found, online, a message from Temple B'nai Abraham - a synagogue in Decatur, IL, that was unfortunately closing its doors, and was looking for suitable prospects to give new life and meaning to their 2 pieces of cherished wall art -a 7' wooden inlaid piece of their namesake, Abraham, and, a Tree of Life!

We exchanged several emails indicating our potential interest and hoped that something could be figured out to complete this wonderful opportunity. Several months passed, with no further communication, and we thought that another decision was made, and we were not meant to be the new home for their Tree.

Well, out of the blue, another email arrived asking if we were still interested! I said yes, and learned they were not looking to sell, but rather donate these items to the right congregation. The only issue to be decided upon was shipping and transporting these large pieces from Decatur to Franklin, NC. Estimates of shipping and crating ran upwards of \$1,200!

Then, to add icing to our cake, Maury Burstein sent in a check to cover the expenses incurred in transporting the pieces back home to Franklin!

We are all thrilled and honored to have this beautiful Tree of Life in our synagogue. We will update you soon on how to add leaves and stones of honor to memorialize your celebrations, achievements and simchas of your family and loved ones!
